

RAHS ENRICHMENT PROGRAM PACKET FALL 2025

WHAT IS THE ENRICHMENT PROGRAM?

The Enrichment Program is exclusive to RAHS members and offers a variety of classes for Preschoolers through 12th graders. Classes are designed by volunteer parents/teachers to benefit the needs of homeschoolers. Our goal is to provide classes that will enrich our children's educational experience. Academic core classes are not the priority. *These classes are not presented as accredited public school classes.*

WHEN DO CLASSES TAKE PLACE?

Classes take place on Thursday afternoons 12:00 - 4:00 PM and are scheduled during four periods/hours (12:00 - 12:55; 1:00 - 1:55; 2:00 - 2:55; 3:00 - 3:55). Fall semester classes start **September 18th** and end **November 13th**.

PLAN ON ATTENDING SHOWCASE

Showcase takes place the after the Enrichment semester has been completed at **Calvary Memorial** on **Thursday, November 20th from 6:00-8:00** *unless updated during the enrichment year.*

Showcase is similar to show and tell where we provide students the opportunity to display their work and give presentations related to projects completed during enrichment classes. It gives working parents, grandparents, and the larger RAHS community the opportunity to see what we've been up to. Please mark your calendars now and plan on attending.

WHERE ARE CLASSES HELD?

Classes are held at Calvary Memorial Church located at 4001 Washington Avenue in Racine. Please note that the church keeps all doors locked during business hours. RAHS will have a parent volunteer serving as a Door Monitor located at the doors nearest the parking lot. If the Door Monitor does not recognize you, or your name is not listed on the child's Release of Liability form as someone allowed to drop off/pick up the child, you will need to press the buzzer to be let in by the church secretary. This is the church policy.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES:

All class registrations take place on the RAHS website (www.racineareahomeschoolers.com). Once you are logged in to the website, click on the 'Enrichment' tab located at the top right of the page. Next, click on 'Class Sign Up'. Select the correct tab for your child's age group and all available classes will show up. You will then need to select 'Enroll Now' for each class you are signing your child up for. Please make sure to enter the correct child(ren)'s name for each class (first and last name). Please note that you will need to select the 'Sign up for Parent Jobs' tab to sign up for your two (2) hours if you are not teaching a class. Also note that every family needs to select the 'Fall Registration Fee' tab to pay the per child, per semester fee (this is separate from the RAHS membership fee as well as different class fees).

WHEN DOES REGISTRATION TAKE PLACE?

Registration for **TEACHERS** is open on **Tuesday, August 19th from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

Registration for **GENERAL MEMBERSHIP** (anyone not teaching a class) is open from **Wednesday, August 20th from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

REGISTRATION FEES and CLASS FEES

Registration fees must be paid each semester and are as follows:

- \$15 per child with a max of \$45 per family

Class fees must be paid each semester and are as follows:

- \$5 per child for gym class (gym class fees go primarily to pay for insurance)
- All other classes will have a different fee attached to them. Teachers set the fees for their classes based on necessary materials.
- If you drop classes, you should NOT expect a refund. In most cases the fee is reserving a spot for your child AND paying for purchased supplies and/or insurance. Once the money has been designated, no refunds will be given.
- BEFORE REGISTRATION verify that your child meets the age requirements set forth by the teacher. ALSO There are several classes this semester that have similar names. Please double check both the class name and teacher name against the master grid to make sure you have selected the correct class for your student. (Games classes are age specific and there are several!)
- Please include FIRST and LAST name for EACH child when registering them
- AFTER REGISTRATION verify that your child has a confirmation for each class they intend to take. After signing up for your enrichment classes, you will receive one invoice via email for your registration fees AND your class fees.
- Payment may be made via credit card. Invoices will be sent out by **August 22nd** and **payment is due by August 29th**. Prompt payment is appreciated or you risk losing your child's spot in class to someone on the waiting list.
 - The bookkeeper (Allie Brandon) will have teacher checks sent as soon as payment is processed from families. Please let her know if you are still missing a check by September 8th.

REQUIRED ENRICHMENT FORMS

There are 2 forms that must be completed each Enrichment term. These forms are (1) Enrichment Registration / A Release of Liability and (2) Code of Conduct for appropriate age group of child(ren). These forms must be completed for each student and turned **every** term in prior to the student's first class. These forms can be found on the website by clicking on Enrichment, then the Enrichment Forms link.

PLEASE NOTE: *If you are NOT a teacher this term, please also fill out the parent jobs form. See below for more details on Parent Job Requirements.*

MANDATORY PARENTAL PARTICIPATION

Each family will be required to sign up to serve **two hours** per week for a parent job each semester you have a child in enrichment. Sign-ups for these positions will take place on a Google Docs form that can be accessed via the website on the same day you sign your child(ren) up for their enrichment classes. You will be asked to mark all jobs you are willing to perform as well as all hours you are willing to serve. Upon completion of all registrations, the Enrichment Committee will assign parent jobs based on the preferences you selected. *Examples of parent jobs include: classroom helper, hall monitor, door monitor, nursery, end of day clean up, study hall for 6th-12th grade, floater/sub, etc. Teachers do not need to sign up for a parent job as teaching a class is considered your parent job.*

***Participation in enrichment classes comes with the responsibility of fulfilling volunteer hours.** Enrichment would not be possible without the volunteer work of all families involved. We also understand that illness and other unforeseen issues may interfere with teaching and volunteer duties; and we want your health and family to always come first. Because we are solely volunteer based, please know that excessive absences MAY result in a conversation about other ways you can contribute/volunteer such as cleaning, subbing, organizing inventory or paying a fee.

** Please note that if you sign up to serve in the Nursery during 1st hour you must arrive by 11:45am. This allows time for teachers to drop their children off prior to setting up their classroom. We must have two adults present in the Nursery in order to accept children for any given hour.

***If completing a parent job is a hardship for you at this time, please call / text Jackie Brochhausen @ 262-308-5413 to discuss alternative options.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

Preschoolers: To be eligible for fall semester (September through November), children must be 3 or 4 years old (AND potty trained) by September 1st. To be eligible for fall semester (February through March), children must be 3 or 4 years old (AND potty trained) by January 1st.

Kindergartners: To be eligible for fall semester, children must be 5 years old by September 1st. To be eligible for fall semester, children must be 5 years old by January 1st.

WAITING LISTS

If a class is filled when you try to sign your child up, you may place your child on the waiting list for that class. The 'waiting list' is a forum post where you will write your child's name and class/hour preferred. Please limit each child to only ONE waiting list per hour.

Your child(ren)'s schedule will be available immediately on the website. You can access all of your child(ren)'s classes by clicking on your name in the upper right hand corner of the web page and then clicking on 'My Enrichment Classes'.

If your child has been moved up from the waiting list, you will receive an invoice via email with the cost of that class.

CONDUCT

All teachers have agreed not to hinder the RAHS Statement of Faith.

Respect toward teachers, helpers, fellow students, church staff and buildings will be required at all times.

Students will be in one of the provided classrooms and abide by the authority of the attending adult throughout class time. Parents will be notified if a student refuses to participate OR causes regular disruptions. The Enrichment Committee will handle conflicts only if it becomes necessary. We follow, to the best of our ability, the Matthew 18 principle when handling conflicts. Mat 18:15-17.

Students who do not abide by the rules will be asked to drop from participation. No refund will be given. Thank you for reminding your students of these expectations.

*A Code of Conduct form must be completed for each student and turned in prior to the student's first class. This form can be found on the website by clicking on Enrichment, then Enrichment Documents.

ILLNESS POLICY

If *anyone* in your family has a fever of 100.4 or higher, is throwing up, and/or has diarrhea, we ask that your *entire family* stay home that week.

If you or your child has a cold, we ask that the person that is sick stay home that week. The rest of the family may come to enrichment.

If you or your child has a clear, runny nose, you may still come to enrichment.

We will have hand sanitizer and tissues available in each classroom.

**If you will not be able to attend Enrichment for any reason, please post this on the forum as soon as possible and try to secure a sub for your parent job.

INCLEMENT WEATHER CANCELLATIONS

If the weather is severe and you think classes may be canceled, check online or listen to the radio for school closings. If Racine Unified closes schools because of bad weather, we will cancel our classes as well. If Racine Unified is open, we will run our classes. Class cancellations will also be posted on the RAHS website/forum as soon as we become aware of them.

DRESS CODE

Students must have clean, dry shoes. Clothing must be modest and neat with no offensive words or pictures. Girls who wear dresses and participate in gym class should wear shorts under their dress. No loose jewelry is allowed in the gym.

NURSERY USAGE

The nursery is strictly for preschool and younger aged children of TEACHERS and WORKERS only and is available to them ONLY during the times that they are working. PLEASE DO NOT take your child to nursery if he/she is showing any signs of illness. Anyone with more than a clear runny nose will be returned to their mother canceling her class/work assignment if necessary. Nursery is not available to adults who wish to take classes. They are responsible for their own childcare. Due to safety and liability reasons, children may NOT be left in cars or outside the building without an adult.

SNACKS

You may send a water bottle and a small snack with your child. Please remind your child that snacks are only to be eaten between classes. If your child has a health reason for needing to eat at a designated time, please note that on the Release of Liability form. Please send snacks that can be easily cleaned up and refrain from sending extra sticky, crumbly or messy snacks. This makes extra work for teachers and the end of day clean up crew.
